
54% diagnosed

1,034 13-24-year-olds who self-identified as LGBTQ and resided in the United States participated in this survey.


54% of the participants indicated that they had ever been diagnosed with an eating disorder.

21% (75% out of all respondents) suspected that they had an eating disorder.

In addition to those diagnosed, an additional



71% of transgender respondents who identify as straight have been diagnosed with an eating disorder, with anorexia being the most common


